Possible gas rationing due to the Russia-Ukraine conflict



Dear Sir or Madam,

We are following the development of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict with great concern. In the press you hear about possible gas rationing, which could have serious consequences for the manufacturing industry.

Will possible gas rationing affect supply chains and procurement processes in electronics distribution?

With our statement, we would like to ensure the greatest possible transparency for you.

We are not a manufacturer of electronic components. As a contractual partner of our manufacturers, we ensure, among other things, secure supply chains to you.

The production of electronic components and displays by our contractual partners takes place for the most part in Asia, China, America and not in Europe. A gas rationing in Europe due to the Russia-Ukraine conflict would therefore not be relevant for the production in these countries and would not have any consequences for the procurement.

Gas is not used as a source of energy in our headquarters and warehouse. For the generation of electricity we rely on an environmentally friendly photovoltaic system. We use a large part of the electricity generated in this way ourselves. We feed surplus quantities into the public grid. We have a reliable and generously designed backup power system to cover outages. Our employees are available to you in the sales offices or via mobile working.
